Categories

- Best essay by an undergraduate students (2,000 - 4,000 words)
- Best essay presented by an honours or postgraduate student (2,000 – 5,000 words)

Eligibility

Essays eligible for submission must have been assessed as part of an undergraduate or postgraduate degree at an Australian tertiary institution. Applicants must have been enrolled in a degree by an Australian tertiary institution to be eligible. The essays will be judged by a panel of judges selected by CESAA. The judges' decisions are final.

Prizes

The winning and highly commended essays will be considered for publication in the *Australian and New Zealand Journal of European Studies*.

Prizes will be awarded as gift vouchers to the value of:

Essay Topics

Essays from any discipline - history, politics, law, economics, business, sociology, cultural studies, etc. – will be accepted as long as they deal with contemporary (post-war) Europe and/or the European Union.

The essay should have a separate cover page which includes:

Your name should not appear anywhere else on the essay.
