AUSTRALIA—EU NEWS

Aus-EU FTA

Negotiating Round Five was held in Canberra on October 14-18 with DFAT leading the Australian delegation. The talks have been described as positive and constructive, following the publication of product names the EU wants to protect as geographical indicators (GIs). EU NEWS

Brexit and the UK

October saw many changes in the Brexit countdown to the deadline for a decision on the 31st. Prime Minister Johnson managed to secure a deal with the EU by finding a solution to the controversial Irish border issue. In order to proceed, the deal had to be accepted in the British House of Commons but as with previous deals it was met with resistance. Prime Minister Johnson fulfilled his responsibility and requested a delay to Brexit from the EU in an unsigned letter. The delay has been supported in principle by the EU.

Mr. Johnson now wants to have general elections to be held in the UK on December 12. In order to override the Fixed Term Parliament Act, he needs a two-thirds majority. A vote is scheduled for Monday October 28.

Spain

Catalan separatist leaders were jailed this month over a failed bid for independence in 2017. The sentence has led to a number of protests in Catalonia and Barcelona. In response to recent demonstrations, approximately 80,000 people took to the streets of Barcelona in support of Spanish unity.

Poland

Recent parliamentary elections have delivered a narrow majority win for the Law and Justice (PiS) party. The ruling party secured 235 seats of 460 in the lower house, the biggest opposition winning 134 seats. The nationalist party holds conservative views and has throughout its first term had a confrontational relationship with the EU.

ECB appointment of new President

The European Central Bank (ECB) has formally appointed Christine Lagarde to be the new President on October 18. She will commence her position on November 1 for an eight year renewable mandate.

Eurovision Down Under:The World's Longest-Running Song Contest Embracing Diversity

The Eurovision Song Contest has had a growing following in Australia since national multicultural broadcaster SBS began broadcasting the contest in 1983. Its 65th anniversary in 2020 is testament to its success, both as light entertainment and as an expression of European cultures, societies and politics. The formal Australian participation, which celebrates its own milestone in 2020—its fifth year of participation—has opened a new chapter in this story.

It is thus timely to celebrate Eurovision at 65 and Eurovision Down Under through the first international academic conference on the ESC to be held in Australia, at one of its leading research universities. The theme of Eurovision Down Under 2020 is 'The World's Longest-Running Song Contest: Embracing Diversity'.

At the conference we will present the edited collection Eurovision & Australia: Interdisciplinary Perspectives from Down Under, which includes chapters by the convenors of this conference, Bronwyn Winter and Nina Markovic Khaze.
