AUSTRALIA—EU NEWS

Restrictions of movement between Australia and the European Union

EU leaders have agreed to restrict non-essential travel from Australia into the EU area for a time of 30 days, this time could be extended. Similarly, the Australian government has placed a temporary ban preventing the entry of non-citizens into the country. All measures are being taken to tackle the spread of COVID-19.

National Multicultural Festival

The European External Action Service in Canberra hosted the National Multicultural Festival on February 22, the event was opened by EU Ambassador Michael Pulch. The day celebrated the different culture of the member states with stalls set up and performances in a village square for attendees to enjoy.

Aus-EU FTA

The 6th round of negotiations were held on February 10 - 14. The EU negotiating team was led by Ms Helena König while the Australian team was led by Ms Alison Burrows. The European response to the COVID-19 outbreak

Along with the rest of the world, Europe is responding to the challenges presented from the COVID-19 pandemic. The first major response was seen in Italy with large scale closures across the country. Italy is now the European epicentre with the largest number of cases and deaths related to the virus. Many other member states appear to be following the path of Italy with Spain declaring a state of emergency, Hungary and Ireland enforcing a 15 day lockdown from Friday March 27. All member states are enforcing some form of movement restrictions and limits on public gatherings and the situation continues to change rapidly.

European Commission announcement of funds to fight coronavirus

232 million euro has been allocated to tackle the COVID-19 virus. Half of the funds will be used to support the World Health Organisation (WHO) global preparedness and response plan. Of the member states, Italy has been most significantly affected with numerous cases and deaths reported. Several towns within the Lombardy and Veneto regions of the North, have imposed restrictions and closed public places and schools with measures to be reevaluated on 2 March.

ECB

The ECB announced a contingency plan to help alleviate the economic pressure as a result of the coronavirus pandemic.

€750 billion bonds will be repurchased throughout the year to support the euro area.
